

















### Introduction

Coalition 2030 is an alliance of civil society organisations working to ensure that Ireland keeps its promise to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals, both at home and abroad. Our mission is to transform our world through collaborative partnerships that will free the human race from the tyranny of poverty and want, and to heal and secure our planet. Showing solidarity with those marginalised in society is a key value and organising principle of Coalition 2030, with the goal of 'leaving no-one behind', both in Ireland and throughout the world.

At the time of writing, we are almost at the halfway point between when the SDGs were agreed in September 2015, and when they are due to be achieved, 2030. Consequently, we are keen to grow the membership of this Coalition in order to increase representation of the concerns of civil society in Ireland. Membership is open to all civil society organisations across the domestic anti-poverty and equality, international and environmental sectors, trade unions and academic institutions.

### Overview

Coalition 2030 exists primarily to ensure that the Irish government fulfils its commitment made in 2015 to deliver the SDGs by 2030. To this end, Coalition 2030 engages with the Irish public and policy-makers to increase their awareness of and engagement with the SDGs. We believe that since the SDGs are integrated, interdependent and indivisible, a coherent approach in policy-making underpinned by a whole-of-government approach and strong political leadership is required. Further, this goal will be progressed by an increase in public awareness and a push from below for change. Finally, these two avenues depend on a vibrant, energised and united coalition that collaborates smoothly and effectively. This work plan is thus split into three distinct work packages; 1) Policy and Advocacy on Domestic SDG Implementation, 2) Public Engagement and 3) Coalition Building. The goals nested within each work package flow directly from the objectives and outcomes listed in our Strategic Plan<sup>1</sup>.

### **Process of Work Plan Development**

This work plan was drafted by the Coalition 2030 Coordinator in March 2022 based on the Strategic Plan and was informed by political opportunities and obstacles. It was deliberated upon and revised by the Steering Committee in April and May 2022, before going to the Coalition 2030 plenary in May 2022 for sign-off.

The strategies, tactics and timeline for achieving the goals within will be revisited quarterly in order to respond to an ever-changing political context.

### Annex 1: Our 2020-2023 Strategy

### **Objective 1**

To advocate and advance public policy that would achieve the targets in the SDGs by 2030, and to act as a watchdog on the Government's implementation of the SDGs.

#### **Specific outcomes**

- 1.1 Ireland has a fair and ambitious implementation plan for delivery of the SDGs in full and on time.
- 1.2 The Government fully resources the SDG implementation plan.
- 1.3 The Government meaningfully engages all sections of civil society in particular those furthest behind in developing, monitoring and assessing the delivery of the SDGs.
- 1.4 The Government makes ongoing significant progress and reports annually to the Oireachtas on its delivery of all of the 17 Goals.

### **Objective 2**

To promote engagement and informed action on the SDGs by building a coherent understanding of the issues that impact on the lives of people in Ireland and throughout the world.

#### Specific outcomes

- 2.1 All Irish decision-makers (political representatives and officials) are fully aware of and motivated to take action to increase ambition and the delivery of the SDGs, and as a consequence:
- 2.2 Civil Society and the Irish public are made aware of, and supported to take informed action, in support of the SDGs.

### **Objective 3**

In order to deliver on our objectives for transforming our world, the Coalition will work to ensure it is an effective coalition for collaboration and strengthening the work of its members. Our objective is to be an effective coalition that supports, amplifies and leverages the work of its members to promote our collective vision and achieve our goals.

### Specific outcomes

- 3.1 We are proactive in engaging groups representing those at risk of being 'left behind'.
- 3.2 We share learning and best practice on SDG implementation and activities to ensure that
  quality and excellence in practice, in the sectors represented by Coalition 2030, delivers
  better outcomes for everyone.
- 3.3 We build and share knowledge, skills and capacity of the members of Coalition 2030 through collaborative working.
- 3.4 We support actions which promote the implementation of the SDGs.



- 3.5 Members actively engage in working groups to ensure they contribute their relevant skills (communications, public engagement, policy and advocacy) so that Coalition 2030 can catalyse and initiate actions to deliver on our objectives.
- 3.6 The work of the members in policy and advocacy and in raising awareness is supported by Coalition 2030.
- 3.7 Adequate finance is secured to support the work of Coalition 2030.
- 3.8 We build our power as a network by seeking out and encouraging new members to join.
- 3.9 We regularly review our work, reflect on our impact and amend our work plans based on learning.
